2.C ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

CLOUD PATTERN REMAINS WELL DEGRADED AND DEEP CONVECTION IS LIMITED. THE TROPICAL CHARACTER CAN NOT BE MAINTAINED AND THE EX-BERGUITTA SYSTEM IS THEREFORE NOW POST-TROPICAL DEPRESSION CLASS. THE LAST 0525UTC ASCAT SWATH SHOWS A WIDE CIRCULATION WITH MAXIMUM WINDS ABOUT 40/45KT, VERY FAR FROM THE CENTER.

THE RAPID SOUTHERN TRACK IS NOW PRIMED UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF THE MID-LEVEL RIDGE PRESENT IN THE EAST BUT THE TRACK SLOWS INTO THE EVENING, STOPPED BY A LOW/MID LEVEL RIDGE MOVING SOUTH OF THE SYSTEM. NEXT, BERGUITTA IS EXPECTED TO LEAVE TROPICAL LATITUDES, SOUTH-EASTWARDS, DRIVEN BY THE PASSAGE OF A TROUGH AT SOUTH-EAST. AT LONG RANGE, THE ARRIVAL OF A NEW RIDGE AT SOUTH-WEST MAY SLOW DOWN AGAIN THE LOW.

TODAY, ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS ARE LIKELY TO KEEP DETERIORATING WITH A INCREASING NORTHWESTWARD VERTICAL WINDSHEAR AHEAD AN UPPER LEVEL TROUGH. DESPITE ITS INTERACTION WITH A BAROCLINIC AREA AND THE UPPER TROUGH, EX-BERGUITTA SHOULD KEEP A SHALLOW WARM CORE AND MODERATE CONVECTION. NEXT WEEK, WITH THE DECAY OF THE BAROCLINIC FORCING, THE POST TROPICAL DEPRESSION MAY THEN FILL UP.
